

Promising Practices in Crisis Response

- Systems mapping exercise (e.g., Sequential Intercept Model Mapping)
- Call-taker and dispatcher protocols
- Training in crisis response and intervention



Sequential Intercept Model (SIM)



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Depicts how adults with behavioral health conditions move through the criminal legal system



SIM Mapping Workshop

- A SIM Mapping Workshop can be used to:
 - Assess available resources to support diversion from the criminal legal system
 - Determine gaps in services
 - Enhance relationships across systems and agencies
 - Plan for community change



911 Call Diversion



HIGH RISK	IMMEDIATE THREAT TO PUBLIC SAFETY (SELF/OTHERS)	ACTION
4	Is the person and other people in immediate danger? The person is threatening the personal safety of others. The person is engaged in a suicidal act. The person is known to have access to dangerous weapons. The person is barricaded. The person has taken hostages. The person has a known history of violent crimes or serious acts of violence.	Deploy Emergency Law Enforcement - Emergenc Service Unit - Response. Stage EMS and/or Mobil Crisis Response Team if appropriate.
MODERATE RISK	CALLER NEEDS IN PERSON ASSESSMENT (LE/MH)	ACTION
	Is the person themselves at risk of danger?	Deploy a CIT Officers
3	The person is alone in their home and experiencing thoughts of suicide, but others are not in danger. The person has a specific plan, access to the means and a time frame.	and/or MCRT
	The person is exhibiting signs of intoxication. There is not enough information to use the Risk Assessment Tool because it is a third-party caller.	EMS may be required
LOWER RISK	CALLER NEEDS IN PERSON ASSESSMENT	ACTION
2	Is the person at a lower risk of danger? The person has a specific plan but does not have access to the means. There the person is exhibiting odd or unusual behavior that is of concerns to others. The person themselves or a family member has requested in person support. The person is not exhibiting signs of being under the influence of alcohol or other drugs.	Deploy MCRT Or Divert to Crisis Networ Team if appropriate.
IMMEDIATE REMOTE	CALLER NEEDS IMMEDIATE SUPPORT VIA PHONE	ACTION
1	Does the person require immediate support but does not require an in-person assessment? The person has expressed vague suicidal ideation or is angry at others. The person does not have a specific plan. The person does not have the means to die by suicide, self-harm, or harm to others.	Divert to a member of the CNT.
NO CRISIS	CALLER NEEDS SUPPORT SERVICES OR WARMLINE	ACTION
0	Does the person simply need someone to speak to or is the person in need of access to non-emergent supports? The person expresses concerns of a non-emergent nature. There is no concern of suicide or self-harm. There is no concern for the safety of others.	Divert to CNT. The CNT w connect to a peer suppor warm-line or other supportive services as appropriate.

988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline

- Offers 24/7 access to trained crisis counselors for people in distress
- Formerly known as the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline
- Important for ongoing collaboration between 911 and 988
- Some communities can conduct warm transfers of calls from 911 to 988

Crisis Response and Intervention Training (CRIT)

- CRIT is a 40-hour training designed to prepare law enforcement officers to respond effectively to people in crisis
- CRIT's overall philosophy is officer safety, public safety, and diversion from the criminal justice system, when possible
- Based on the Memphis Model of Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) training

CRIT is designed to complement the development and delivery of crisis response programs



Crisis Response and Intervention Training (CRIT)

- CRIT was developed by the Academic Training to Inform Police Responses, a Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA)supported national initiative
- The CRIT curriculum is available online in the CRIT Toolkit, at no cost to agencies
